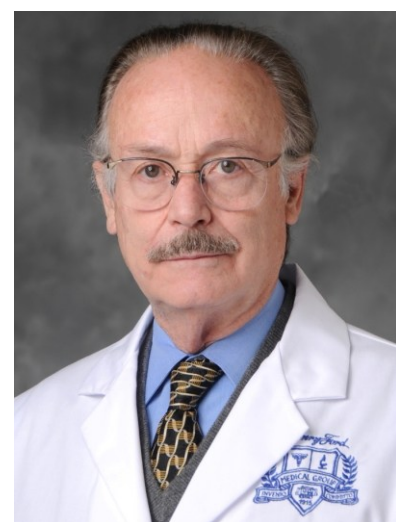
Robert Tigerstedt Award

The American Society of Hypertension, Inc. (ASH) requests nominations for the 2012 ASH Distinguished Scientist Award. One of five (5) awards is given each year depending on the field to which the award recipient has made his/ her contribution. The purpose of the ASH Distinguished Scientist Award is to honor a scientist or physician for outstanding achievements in the field of hypertension. The award recipient will receive a framed certificate and a \$10,000 honorarium. The awardee will be requested to present a 30-minute lecture during the plenary awards session at the ASH Annual Meeting and will receive complimentary registration, reimbursement for travel expenses and hotel accommodations.

Sponsors who wish to have their candidates nominated for an award must be current ASH members and provide the following information:

- ◆ Complete name, address, phone, fax number, and e-mail address of the nominee
- ◆ A signed letter of nomination from the sponsor and at least one additional supporting letter. The letters should clearly articulate the major contributions of the nominee to the field of hypertension
- ◆ A current curriculum vitae of nominee

A candidate may be nominated by one or more ASH members within the same year. Previous recipients of the ASH Distinguished Scientist Awards (**see page 3**) and members of the ASH Scientific Awards Committee (**see page 6**) are not eligible for nomination.

Distinguished Scientist Award Categories

Richard Bright Award

This award is named for Richard Bright, (1789- 1858). Often referred to as the Father of Nephrology, Dr. Bright is well known for his great contributions to the study of the kidney. He was the author of the significant *Reports of Medical Cases* (Vol. I, 1827) in which he describes certain undiscovered forms of nephritis. He was the leading consultant of his time and he contributed a great many important clinical observations.

Harriet Dustan Award

This award is named for Harriet P. Dustan, MD (1920 - 1999). Dr. Dustan made many contributions to hypertension in her career of over 40 years. These include her clinical and investigative achievements, especially the concept of essential hypertension as a multifactorial disease of pressure regulation and her contributions to hypertension as related to women's health. Dr. Dustan explored many of the pressor mechanisms and related new knowledge to therapeutic concepts.

William Harvey Award

This award is named for scientist William Harvey (1578- 1657) who developed the first accurate account of how the heart and circulatory system operated. His controversial book entitled "*An Anatomical Study of the Motion of the Heart and of Blood in Animals*" eventually became the basis for modern research on the heart and blood vessels.

Irvine Page Award

This award is named for Irvine H. Page, MD (1901 – 1991). In Dr. Page's long research career he made endless discoveries and contributions to the treatment and espousal of hypertension. He may be best known for the discovery and characterization of angiotensin, the identification of serotonin, and the mosaic theory.

Robert Tigerstedt Award

Robert Tigerstedt (1853- 1923) is recognized as an outstanding contributor to both endocrinology and circulation. He is best known for his discovery of the renin- angiotensin system at the Karolinska Institute in Stockholm, Sweden. Dr. Tigerstedt's discovery allowed great strides in the research of hypertension, kidney disease, heart failure and other forms of cardiovascular disease.

Young Scholars Award

ASH members may nominate a qualified young investigator for the 2012 ASH Young Scholars Award. The Young Scholars Award recognizes the achievements of outstanding young investigators in the field of hypertension. The awardee will receive \$6,000: \$3,000 to the investigator as an individual award and \$3,000 to support his/her research laboratory. The awardee will also be asked to give a brief lecture presenting the research for which the award was given at the ASH Annual Scientific Meeting.

Only candidates from North America will be considered. Candidates must have received an advanced, professional degree within the last 15 years and be currently active in research in hypertension or related cardiovascular disease.

A candidate may be nominated by one or more ASH members within the same year. Previous winners of the ASH Young Scholars Awards (**see page 5**) and members of the ASH Scientific Awards Committee (**see page 6**) are not eligible for nomination.

Marvin Moser Clinical Hypertension Award

An Award for a Clinician who has Devoted his or her Career to the Care of Hypertensive Patients

The Society will recognize a qualified Hypertension Clinician for his or her dedication to the treatment and care of hypertensive patients, and is requesting nominations for qualified candidates for the Marvin Moser Clinical Hypertension Award. The award will be given each year at the ASH Annual Scientific Meeting. The award recipient will receive a \$5,000 honorarium, given by the Hypertension Education Foundation, as well as complimentary registration to the ASH Annual Scientific Meeting, reimbursement for travel expenses and hotel accommodations for two nights to attend the Annual Meeting. In addition, the award recipient will be recognized at the ASH Twenty-Seventh Annual Scientific Meeting during the Awards Plenary Session, to be held on Monday, May 21, 2012.

A candidate may be nominated by one or more ASH members within the same year. Previous winners of the Marvin Moser Clinical Hypertension Award (**see page 5**) and members of the ASH Scientific Awards Committee (**see page 6**) are not eligible for nomination.

Candidate Qualifications

- ◆ **Required:** Current ASH Member
- ◆ **Required:** Physician
- ◆ **Required:** Clinician currently treating hypertensive patients as a major component of his or her practice
- ◆ **Desired:** Active Involvement in hypertension community outreach program
- ◆ **Contributory:** Currently active in teaching, e.g., university-based, clinics, hospitals, etc.
- ◆ **Contributory:** Active participation in developing guidelines and in clinical trials that focus on improving blood pressure control

Application Requirements

- ◆ Only ASH Members can nominate candidates
- ◆ Sponsor submission of complete name, address, phone/fax numbers, and e-mail address of nominee
- ◆ Signed letter of nomination articulating major contributions of nominee to the treatment and care of hypertensive patients
- ◆ At least one additional supporting letter
- ◆ Complete curriculum vitae
